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#### REPORTS FROM THE STANDING COMMITTEES

### **Silt & Erosion -** James Taylor, chair.

Jim Taylor reported the house at 840 East Lake was demolished today. The contract also includes removing piles of limbs and debris, and a tree that is down, posts at the end of the gravel, and a post on each side of the weir. They have offered to also take down the shed down for \$2,500 and the large dead tree next to it for 2,200. Rick Welle made a motion to approve \$4,700 to remove the old shed and tree. John Bode seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Stutz also gave a bid on the inflow washed out at Barnett Common area 2. They can do a quick fix for \$2,750, which is lower than the previous bids. The Commons budget will cover it. Taylor also reported it would be possible to clean out a couple of smaller coves while the lake is down next year. There are a couple of areas where it would be possible to excavate from the shore. Stutz to provide estimates of areas where they can mechanically dredge when the lake is lowered in 2026 and to work on recommendations for future work in Cove A.

### **Building and Architecture -** Andy Leek and Terry Reising, co-chairs.

The committee issued permits for solar panels at 336 West Lake and 568 East Lake Drive.

**Common Areas** – Ben Richey - The inflow at B2 discussed above will be repaired.

# **Dam Maintenance:** Roy Wehling, chair.

The annual inspection has been completed. The inspectors recommended continuing to watch for vegetation growth on the front side of the dam, to caulk the back side of the spillway. Roy said he would test the spillway gate in November and work with the mowers to get the brush on the North side cleaned up.

### **Fish and Wildlife** – Todd McClew, chair.

Todd reported the committee is keeping a watch on area wildlife. He believes IDNR has Dunlap Lake on the list for fish shocking in 2026. The Illinois muskrat trapping season runs from November 10, 2025, through February 15, 2026.

### **Master Plan Implementation (MPI)** – Robert Ribbing, chair.

Association documents have been pulled into teams. There will not be a meeting in November.

#### **Restrictions** – Graham Johnson, chair.

There are rotting stairs on W6 that need to be removed and the owners at 127Hollyhock still need to remove the fallen tree from the lake.

**Safety -** John Bode, chair – 1 boat sticker

Nothing new to report from Executive or Legal, Meetings, Elections and Social committees.
